Dear Med Sci 1 student,

Requirements for Med Sci 1 students to progress to Med Sci 2 have changed.

You now have the opportunity to reduce your course load this Fall/Winter without sacrificing your eligibility for Med Sci 2. We would encourage you to maintain a full course load of 5.0 courses during the fall/winter, however, if you think you can't meet the *minimum* requirements to progress to Med Sci 2 (identified below) you have the option to drop course(s) and take them later (usually in the summer).

See the <u>Academic Calendar</u> or the Changes below for a summary of what has changed.

The deadline to drop a first-term half course is **Monday, November 13th.** The course will appear *exactly the same* whether you drop it today or on the drop deadline: WDN, Withdrawn without Academic Penalty.

Things to consider when dropping a course:

- Any dropped courses will likely have to be picked up next summer. *Summer tuition cost* may be a consideration.
- Reducing your course load could impact *applications for graduate or professional programs*. Do your homework - A full load of 5.0 courses during the fall/winter may be required for GPA consideration.
- There may be *financial implications* to reducing your course load, for instance eligibility for *scholarships, bursaries*, or other *financial assistance*. Refer to the experts in the Office of the Registrar before making any decisions.
- Connect with an advisor in the Academic Counselling Office
 <u>https://www.uwo.ca/sci/counselling/advising_services/index.html</u> to work out a strategy for
 planning your courses moving forward especially if you are considering dropping multiple
 courses. They can help you *prioritize course completion* based on upper year course
 prerequisites and summer availability.

Consider the decision carefully - you have plenty of time to decide if dropping a course is right for you.

The Changes:

Updated requirements are in the <u>Academic Calendar</u> and a summary of the changes is as follows: To progress from Medical Sciences 1 to Medical Sciences 2, students must meet the following requirements prior to the beginning (September) of Medical Sciences 2 by the end of the fall/winter of Medical Sciences 1:

- 1. Achieve a minimum grade of 50% in any course(s) taken during Medical Sciences First Entry (including summer sessions);
- 1. Successfully complete a full load of 5.0 courses during the Fall/Winter of Medical Sciences 1;
- 2. Achieve a PASS in Medical Sciences 1000Y (non-credit course);
- 3. Achieve a mark of at least 50% in 1.0 1000-level course(s) from either Category A or B; and

- 4. Achieve a mark of at least 60% in the first attempt at each of the half courses listed above in Biology, Chemistry, and mathematics (i.e., courses in Applied Mathematics, Calculus, Mathematics)
- 5. Achieve a mark of at least 60% in the first attempt at each of the half courses listed above in Physics or Computer Science. Students may defer the completion of these two 0.5 requirements to the Fall/Winter of Medical Sciences 2.
