1. Welcome & Additions to Minutes

Dr. Bauman welcomed everyone to the meeting.

2. Approval of Meeting Minutes – May 17, 2022

3. Current Business

3.1 R & E Update

Dr. Sarah Mattonen, R & E Co-Lead reported that the 2022 June 10 event was an overall success with 250 registrants and 220 attendees. Eight oral and seventy-six posters were presented with twenty-two trainees receiving awards. New this year was an informal mentorship session. Overall feedback was positive. There is approximately \$10,000 remaining in this year's budget which can likely be used for the 2023 event. This is likely due to Covid protocols (boxes lunches and no bar) and a local keynote speaker.

3.2 TIORG Update

Dr. John Ronald reported the group will reconvene tomorrow for its first meeting of the academic year. Planning has begun for 2022-2023 and a survey was generated and sent to members for feedback. Group may be hosting a fall retreat, a symposium in early February, and quarterly dinner meetings instead of monthly meetings. They hope to formalize the weekly Journal Club to include more labs, and there are plans to create a new website. Several members of the group have applied for a CFI grant and members can apply for the OICR Windows of Opportunity grant.

3.3 CTCR Renewal

Draft report has been generated with hopes to submit to an external reviewer by end of October, beginning of November. In order to show the center's potential impact on interdisciplinary collaborations, Dr. Bauman has requested a report from Western Research's, Bibliometrics and Research Impact Analyst to generate a list of all members publications over the last 5 years. Since our center is unique and with a purpose to help generate collaborations, we can put forward that the TIORG was formed as a direct result. We plan on also submitting a report of the TIORG member's publications from its existence to date. **ACTION ITEM: GSB and KS**

Goal is to publish the results and have the patient perspective added going forward to oncology trainees' courses.
