Resuscitation Preference Conversations: What if it is not just one conversation type?

Objectives:

- 2. Recognize when they are in a conversation typology that is not the standard type and the importance of adjusting their conversation to compensate for this

- 4. Describe a few of the resuscitation preference conversation typologies and their implications for holding these conversations
- 5. Discuss when and how it might be important to incorporate "what if/what next" into their conversations
- 6. Be willing to explicitly address concern when having a "healthcare team concerned about choice" conversation
