Resuscitation Preference Conversations: What if it is not just one conversation type?

Dr. Goldszmidt is a clinician scientist in the department of medicine (DOM), division of general internal medicine. He is also a DOM Associate Chair and the Site Chief at UH. His program of research is focused on communication and collaboration practices at the intersection of patient care and trainee education.

Objectives:

2. Recognize when they are in a conversation typology that is not the standard type and the importance of adjusting their conversation to compensate for this

4. Describe a few of the resuscitation preference conversation typologies and their implications for holding these conversations
5. Discuss when and how it might be important to incorporate “what if/what next” into their conversations
6. Be willing to explicitly address concern when having a “healthcare team concerned about choice” conversation
