#### **Rotation expectations:**

- Must attend mandatory Monday morning teaching sessions
- Have defined objectives for personal learning prior to starting the rotation and review these with your preceptor during your first rotation (if possible)
- Focused history, physical exam, formulation of differential diagnosis and management plan for patients
  - O <u>Junior residents</u> will be expected to give the appropriate differential diagnoses and management plan to staff physician; help with rescitative and trauma patients
  - O <u>Senior residents</u> will be expected to do the above and make an accurate diagnosis; actively participate in resuscitation and trauma patients; assessment will be made of their ability to function independently and efficiently
- Become proficient at procedures such as Lumbar Puncture, casting, abscess incision and drainage, suturing, eye examination with fluorescein/slit lamp, foreign body removal from nasal cavity, ear canal and skin

#### **Staff teaching sessions**

- MANDATORY Monday morning teaching sessions from 0800 to 1030
  - o You must attend 3 out of the 4 teaching sessions
  - o Failure to attend will affect your final evaluation
- Exemptions are as follows:
  - o Approved vacation/conference leave
  - o Worked until 0200 (you are still welcome to attend if you like)

#### **Evaluations:**

- It is the responsibility of the resident to make sure that an evaluation form is filled at the end of EACH SHIFT
  - O We recommend you ask the staff with whom you reviewed the most patients to do your shift evaluation ONE HOUR prior to the end of the staff's shift (this may be different than yours)
- The staff assigned to you as your Preceptor should notify you if there is a concern at the mid-rotation mark; this is to help you if you are failing to meet expectations
- Final evaluation will be submitted via the One45 system
- Your Preceptor is your contact person if you have any questions/concerns
  - O You are also welcome to speak with the senior fellows and PGE Coordinators
