Anatomy & Cell Biology is delighted to welcome Dr. Vanessa Dumeaux to the Department as a new tenuretrack Assistant Professor in the area of computational cell biology and bioinformatics starting on April 1, 2022. Dr. Dumeaux's research program is focused on using high-throughput data including genomics and metagenomics coupled with data science to predict benefit from lifestyle and therapeutic interventions. This includes investigation of the molecular aspects of human physiology and disease incidence/prognosis in

the context of an individual's exposures & lifestyle, immune response, and the microbiome. Dr. Dumeaux is also the Founder and President of SCIEL, a not-forprofit cooperative of researchers in life and computer sciences with expertise in modern -omics, data science and deep learning. Dr. Dumeaux's recruitment is part of an exciting broader strategic initiative to enhance data science research and teaching expertise with the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry. 
