
The Western Conference on Science Education

The conference included presentations by Kayla Vieno (Rogers/Campbell Lab) on anatomical variations in anatomy education, and Bryn Bhalerao (Clinical Anatomy), who delivered a poster presentation on the pedagogical tool crib sheets. 

We would LOVE your help again. This year the need is so high with rising costs of everything! These kiddos in the picture set a goal of 400 new backpacks this year...will you help us get there?






