Mechanisms of Musculoskeletal Pain: Neurons and the Neighbourhood

Anne-Marie Malfait, MD, PhD, is Professor of Medicine and the George W. Stuppy, MD, Chair of Arthritis at Rush University. Her group studies the relationship between joint damage and the neurobiological processes that underlie pain associated with rheumatic diseases. Dr. Malfait has co-authored more than 100 peer reviewed papers. She is the Director of the P30-funded Chicago Center for Musculoskeletal Pain (NIAMS), and co-director of a T32 that provides postdoctoral training in Joint Health. She is PI of RE-JOIN, an NIH-funded consortium aimed at mapping the joint-nerve interactome of the knee. She is strongly committed to motivating young researchers to join the efforts to study osteoarthritis and joint pain.

The lecture series and graduate student award was established to highlight outstanding contributions to the field of musculoskeletal research in honor of Dr. Suzanne Bernier, a wonderful colleague, collaborator, and mentor, who passed away in 2007.


