The 1.0 common course (either one full course or two half courses) with the highest marks are double-counted/used toward both Major modules. 1.0 of the remaining 2.0 common courses is used only toward the Major in One Health and the other remaining 1.0 common course is used only toward the Major in Pathology, leaving each Major short by 1.0 course. For each module, 1.0 "substitute course" must be taken.
