## Update on CBME for PGME March 2019

Reporting LIVE! Or just doing questionable karaoke?



March 19, 2019

Hoorah! Stephanie Giberson-Kirby and I have now met with all 2019 programs who are launching CBME this July. Our next focus is meeting with 2018 programs at their Competence Committee meetings to identify the needs at that stage.

I'm starting to get a better sense of what's happening on the ground and to keep you in the loop, I'd like to give a breakdown of our current and future actions.

#### **Current Actions:**

- 1) Feedback Survey sent out on March 18th https://uwo.eu.gualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV 82lhjMdQx9w07tj
- 2) A meeting with **Schulich Information Services (IS)** re. immediate Elentra needs took place last week and Chris Watling and I will continue working directly with IS for follow-up & monitoring:

2017 programs	Data migration/no loss of ePortfolio data; form building; training frontline faculty
2018 programs	Data reporting (temporary measure of Excel reporting from raw data to be available in 2-3 weeks, will present to upcoming CC meetings for feedback)
2019 programs	Form building; training frontline faculty
2020 programs	Options for those who want to soft launch
All programs	Realistic timeline for data reporting and more robust features of MSFs and non-EPA assignments in Elentra
	Continued work towards a communications strategy regarding all of the above

- 3) Work Study student hired last month to prepare data reporting for CCs
- 4) Find **Sylvia's replacement** ASAP; the message of our concern about whether there is enough human resources for such a large undertaking like Elentra has been raised

#### **Future Actions:**

- 1) In 2 weeks: share results of feedback survey and decide next steps based on results
- 2) All CBME programs: Sylvia's last day with us is Friday, April 12: (
  She will be rolling out workshops until that time to ensure you're in a good spot for form building in Elentra. She has already contacted those who completed their contextual variable requirements before March for workshops on Thursday, March 21 and Friday, March 22. Stay tuned for another workshop in early April and she will contact you for further details.
- 3) <u>2019 programs</u>: Faculty Development "In-Services" to help your launch, in replacement of a spring PGME CBME retreat separate email to follow
- 4) <u>2018 programs</u>: sharing of CC data reporting files (temporary measure done by Work Study student) separate emails to follow
