
CALL TO ORDER & APPROVAL OF MINUTES

3. ELENTRA UPDATE – P. MORRIS			
DISCUSSION	 Elentra updated to version 1.21 as planned on January 29th. Updates were mainly foundational in nature, with little visual impact to end users. Critical security patches were applied. IS is aware of continuing speed issues, specifically when loading the dashboard. They are actively investigating solutions and hope this will be addressed in the coming weeks. P. Morris highlighted the thumbs up feature in Elentra, which allows residents to provide comments on assessor's feedback (i.e. was it helpful to your learning?) The thumbs up feature can be accessed by clicking on the 'assessment' button in the dashboard. This will display all assessment forms. To provide feedback on a specific EPA, click the thumbs up icon (1) to open a comment box. Please make use of this feature whenever you received useful feedback. Note: the pushpin icon (4) allows you to pin an assessment. You can then sort by pinned assessments in the toolbar. Note: the eyeball icon (3) indicates any assessments that you have not yet marked as read. 		





4. FACULTY ENGAGEMENT – DR. J. VERGEL DE DIOS			
DISCUSSION	 A. Good distributes EPA reports to all programs twice per year. These reports are from a program perspective and do take into account outside faculty. Messaging has stressed the importance of faculty completing EPAs. Dr. L. Champion and Dr. J. Vergel de Dios are meeting with program PDs, CBME Leads, and Chair Chiefs to discuss faculty accountability on a program-by-program basis.

9. PRI	E-MEET	'ING Q	UESTI	IONS

- Dr. A. Zaki provided a summary of the resident-only discussion.
- Pre-meeting question #1: "Have you received useful or helpful feedback and/or coaching from doing EPAs? If so, what did you find most useful or helpful? Was it the content of the feedback, the frequency, the sense of a coaching relationship, etc.?"
 - Residents reported feedback is most useful when residents are observed completing
 activities or EPA tasks. However, in some situations where residents are already being
 observed anyway (i.e. when working one-on-one with faculty), EPAs don't provide much
 in addition to the feedback they are receiving simply by working one-on-one with faculty.
 - Residents find it especially helpful to review EPAs for feedback when the 'next steps' section' is complete.
 - Despite already receiving feedback when working one-on-one, residents like having an EPA filled in as well as this formalizes the process.
 - EPAs are useful in getting feedback on tasks that would not normally be observed.
 - The biggest issue lies in getting residents to be observed in the first place. Depending on this program, this either does or does not happen naturally throughout the day.
 - Dr. J. Vergel de Dios asked residents for suggestions on how faculty can improve their ability to observe residents. One suggestion she has heard is to come up with a schedule for EPAs later in the day during morning handover (i.e. determining which residents require which EPAs that day).
 - Dr. S. Hinton noted that she has had EPAs completed during morning rounds. If you know which EPAs you require, staff can prepare for them ahead of time.
- Pre-meeting question #2: "Regarding milestones, do you find them useful, whether they are
 incorporated into feedback given to you by your observer/coach or if you review them when
 reviewing your completed EPA forms? Or, do you review them beforehand when preparing to do
 an EPA?"
 - Dr. A. Zaki explained that residents find milestones least helpful when there is inconsistency between milestones marked as achieved and the overall score (i.e. all milestones are marked as achieved, but residents are given an overall score of 2-4 → leads to confusion as residents do not know what is missing).
 - Dr. A. Zaki noted that some milestones simply do not apply to the situation (i.e. there may be a few of the 7 milestones that do not apply to the patient and are therefore not achieved).
 - Some residents reported milestones as not helpful. Rather, they get the most out of verbal feedback.

DISCUSSION

	 Dr. J. Vergel de Dios explained that PGME is offering CBD refresher presentations to any interested programs. In these presentations, they stress that scores of 1-3 can count as an achieved observation, given the context. Dr. A. Zaki noted that despite education directed towards faculty, it seems there may still be some misunderstanding of O-scores as some faculty will never assign scores of 4-5 if faculty were present to review (i.e., until faculty are not required to review anything, a score of 5 will not be given). Dr. J. Vergel de Dios explained that some faculty may not be comfortable in giving a score of 5. Next steps are to be okay with this and messaging this to residents as appropriate.
