She was previously the Assistant Dean for Curriculum and Planning at the Northern Ontario School of Medicine and before that led the educational technology team for medicine, veterinary medicine, and dentistry at the University of Edinburgh. Widely published and recognized for her many contributions to medical education, Dr. Ellaway's work has encompassed technology and systems in medical education, social accountability, context, admissions, realism, and the philosophy of science. She has led the development of open source software and data standards that are widely used around the world, she is the qualitative editor of *Advances in Health Science Education*, and the creatrix of the AMEE Fringe.
