He completed his medical training, paediatrics residency, and academic general paediatrics fellowship at the University of Toronto and the Hospital for Sick Children, where he also served as Chief Resident.

He is a PhD candidate in Health Professions Education Research at IHPME in collaboration with the Wilson Centre. His qualitative research examines hidden curriculum, governmentality, and equity issues shaping professional identities in clinical and learning environments. His work is supported by the SSHRC Vanier Scholarship and the Royal College Robert Maudsley Fellowship, with publications in Academic Medicine and Medical Education. His aim is to help create more effective, fair, and accountable learning environments that support both trainees and patient care.



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
