#### 3.0 BUSINESS:

#### 4.0 NEW BUSINESS:

- 4.1 <u>Cancer Research Themes</u>: (Attachment 1, updated from ALT edits)
  - G. Bauman updated the group on Cancer Research Themes as the Oncology Strategic Plan identified the need for themes. CTCR will keep it in discussion and on the forefront to move forward with unified themes. This will enable to identify as a structure with community buy in. Dr. Bauman drafted Advanced Cancer Research as: Supporting a vision of "united cancer care, research and education to improve the future of cancer patients" the Department of Oncology and Centre for Translational Cancer Research we both:
    - > Identify these strategic foci for citywide advanced cancer research.
    - develop and support strong interdisciplinary teams and programs of cancer research

As a result, this ties the vision and priority for a strategic plan with two major themes each with sub themes. The advanced cancer research includes: cancer metastasis, improving therapeutic ratio of treatments, and clinical translational teams linked and supported by citywide programs. The committee agreed to fine-tune the themes to ensure they are balanced and not limiting. Drs. A. Allan and Dr. G. Bauman will edit and bring forward to the ALT Committee in April. After approved by CTCR Management Committee in May, the themes will be brought forward to the Department of Oncology. **Action:** Revisit the Advanced Cancer Themes at May CTCR meeting with edits from ALT.

4.2 PubMed: Translational Research in Radiation Oncology: (Attachment 2)

Dr. G. Bauman showcased an interesting article from Dr. R. Dar that is trying to gauge impact of research. This Dutch article looked at How efficient is translational research in radiation oncology by publishing over 4 years of research data. They created a metrics to look at impact and to Increase of impact and identified barriers of translation. Dr. G. Bauman questions if this is practical for us to do within our environment? The Department of Oncology currently has a standardized search strategy that could be utilized for this research. Potentially, the CTCR could look at a cross section of articles, within a specified timeline and look at the top 20 and see the translational impact. The question is the difficulty and difference made by presenting the impact of cancer research within the city. A concern identified is the lack of benchmarks available for this research. This was identified as a possible future student project for the largest impact of translational research in the city. The CTCR committee is to think about this project bring back for more discussion in future about how impact is measured.

#### 4.3 Research & Education Day:

K. Trudgeon updated members Research & Education Day is upcoming Friday, June 8, 2018. Luciana Brown is the Event Coordinator and will sending out a communication over the next week. K. Trudgeon updates members that Abstract submissions open Monday March 26<sup>th</sup> and close Wednesday April 18<sup>th</sup> at 12 noon. Abstracts are to be submitted on-line. Registration will open on Friday, April 6<sup>th</sup> and close Friday, June 1<sup>st</sup>. Announcements for nominations for the Department of Oncology Teaching Awards and the Denise Power Staff Award of Excellence will be made over the next few weeks. Anticipated assistance from CTCR Management Committee will come directly from Co-chairs Drs. Alex Louie



and Stew Gaede for volunteer judges for the event. Information about the event will be posted throughout the building and accessible on-line at the Department of Oncology, CTCR and CaRTT web pages.
