PROGRAM OUTLINE

This half-day course, co-developed by Western University and the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario, offers a focused examination of the core principles of diagnosis and treatment planning in dentistry. Designed as a companion to the Applied Course in Diagnosis and Treatment Planning, it lays the groundwork for clinical decision-making through a focused exploration of foundational concepts.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Upon successful completion* of this course, participants will be able to:

- List the key steps to formulate and refine a diagnosis and identify treatment options, including completing a thorough medical history and dental history, conducting key clinical examinations, generating a problem list and applying an iterative, staged treatment approach.
- Explain the professional, legal and ethical requirements for generating a diagnosis, implementing a treatment plan and documenting it in the patient record.
- Describe the importance of discussing the diagnosis and treatment options with the patient at each phase of treatment as part of the consent for treatment process.
- Identify tactics to strengthen their own diagnosis and treatment planning skills.
