

Name of Rotation:	Geriatric Medicine Outpatient Clinic
Rotation Lead:	Dr. Jenny Thain
Brief Description of Rotation:	This rotation will provide a mixture of general geriatrics, ageing brain and memory, osteoporosis, falls, movement disorder and onco-geriatrics (heme onc.) clinic experiences. In addition to clinic, there is opportunity to attend weekly rounds (journal club, difficult cases discussion and grand rounds).

Description of Clinical Duties:	Outpatient Clinic rotation is to provide the resident with the opportunity to develop/enhance their skills in the CanMEDS competencies in an ambulatory setting. Residents will be expected to attend outpatient clinic and conduct themselves in a professional manner.
Sample Schedule or description of the workload:	Residents will take part in a combination of clinics that vary from week to week. We recognize that Wednesday afternoons are protected teaching for FM AHD.
On-Call Requirements:	Geriatric Rehabilitation Unit Home Call (3 days during week or weekend)
Description of Setting in which the residents will work:	Outpatient clinic setting will be at Parkwood Institute Main Building and St. Joseph's Hospital outpatient clinic spaces. There is sufficient space and resources such as computers and internet access to complete their clinical duties.
Clinical Supervision:	Residents will be directly supervised by a Geriatrician or Affiliated Specialist (Dr. Patwardhan is a Neurologist cross appointed between Clinical Neurosciences and Geriatric Medicine involved in ageing brain and memory and movement disorder clinics).
