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	<p>Midwives view pregnancy and childbirth as a profound time in a person's life, with a variety of personal and cultural meanings. They see themselves as partners in their clients' care and recognize clients as the primary decision-makers. Ontario's midwifery model of care is based on three principles: continuity of care; informed choice and choice of birthplace. Midwives attend births at both home and hospital and birthing centers.</p> <p>Capacity limit- 1 resident per half day.</p>	
Nephrology	<p>Depending on the timing of the rotation request, this may affect whether it is Outpatient Nephrology clinic versus Inpatient consultation service and dialysis. Outpatient focus is management of chronic kidney disease; other topics frequently encountered include refractory hypertension, proteinuria, anemia, electrolytes, Pre Dialysis patients and transplant. Inpatient service is variable, involving management of acute kidney injury as well as managing general internal medicine within Chronic Kidney Disease patients. Complex patients with multiple medical comorbidities are common, often involving a team-based approach to care. Exposure to either Outpatient or Inpatient allows for similar discussions of approaches to Acute Kidney Injury, Chronic Kidney Disease, Hyperkalemia, Hyponatremia, Hypertension, Proteinuria, Dialysis and Hypertension.</p>	Dr. Amit Bagga

Pharmacy	<p>The pharmacy department elective would include shadowing the inpatient pharmacy personnel through the drug distribution process for the hospital. The medical resident will be shadowing the pharmacist verifying the orders in the inpatient pharmacy and observe how a pharmacist: checks for drug interactions, checks medications compounded by pharmacy technicians, checks for dosing and/or other problems which arise with an order. The shadowing of a pharmacist would then be extended to include shadowing a clinical pharmacist on the units (critical care, pediatrics, infectious diseases).
