
## **Types of Programs**

#### Category 1 programs

- ER, COE, Palliative Care, SEM, FPA
- Cannot deviate from the program objectives

#### Category 2 programs

- Programs that have been designed at the university level that adhere to the guiding principles of Enhanced Skills training in the CFPC red book, but do not have a nationally agreed upon set of guidelines, objectives and evaluations
- More internal flexibility with regards to training



### **Enhanced Skills Chief Resident**

- Chief ES Resident
  - Elected by all ES residents
- Represents the residents at the RPC
  - Will voice concerns or comments of peers at meetings
- Resident wellness representative







## Tracking Clinical Encounters MyFM

- Component of Competency Based Medical Education (CBME)
- 50 "field notes" for 12 month program, 25 "field notes" for 6 block program
- Breadth of variety of encounters, highlight progress from learner to mastery
- Reflective practice of learning

Residents enrolled in Emergency Medicine or FRCP residents have a separate program for tracking clinical experiences and are excluded from this requirement.





## **Longitudinal Experience MyFM**

- Adhering to guiding principle of family medicine Continuity of Care
- Identify a minimum of 2 patients and seek permission to follow longitudinally over program
  - Consent from patient to follow up
  - Discuss with clinical preceptor at time of first contact
- Log minimum 2 "field notes"

These encounters will be reviewed with your program director during your periodic review and tracked within the One45 system periodic review evaluation periodic review evaluation. EM / FRCP residents exempt.





## **Scholarly Activity**

- All residents must complete a scholarly project
- Research project, QI, Literature review, Case reports (discuss what is acceptable with your PD)
- Example ES Scholarly Activity Proposal on ES website <u>www.schulich.uwo.ca/familymedicine/postgraduate/</u> <u>enhanced skills programs.html</u>

- Topics should be based on current area of specialization in family medicine
- Funding available through the Centre for Studies in Family Medicine




### Office of Distributed Education (DE) Rotations
