- Located in the southwest corner of London, near Springbank Park
- 25,000 patient visits per year

Research Activities

A research assistant is available one day per week to help with staff and resident projects

Practice Experience

- Patient population is mixed suburban and rural
- In-hospital care of patients occurs at LHSC Victoria Hospital
- Patients are cared for at Dearness Nursing Home
- Social worker, nurse practitioner and public health nurse on site
- Office is equipped to do minor surgical procedures
- Became a Family Health Organization in 2009

Teaching

- Eight residents for each 16-week Family Medicine block
- Four staff physicians, three associate family physician teachers
- Each unit includes four residents, two staff physicians and two nurses
- Chief resident organizes the call schedule and weekly resident rounds
- Teaching in obstetrics is available to residents
- Home call responsibility is approximately one in eight with appropriate staff supervision
- Resident seminars are held twice weekly
