Through the MD/PhD Program you will receive training to become a clinician scientist and a leader in medical research and patient care. You will have the opportunity to train with leading scientists and integrate laboratory work with medical school, compressing the time to obtain two degrees in just seven years.

Mentorship is a vital component for your success in this program, and you will be matched with a faculty mentor who is a clinician scientist and/or a member of the MD/PhD Committee. You will also be paired with a senior MD/PhD student or a recent graduate.

Each year, only a few exceptional students with a passion for research and health care are admitted into the program.

APPLICATION DEADLINES	December 1 – application deadline (different from application to be submitted to OMSAS)	
FUNDING	The Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry will provide a scholarship for \$10,000 x 4yrs (total \$40,000) of medical tuition to offset the principal costs of the four-year undergraduate medical program. During the research phases of the combined program, students will receive a stipend in accordance with the PhD level for their respective graduate program.	

Candidates currently completing MS degree programs will be required to have completed all requirements for their graduate degrees prior to registration in the program. A student wishing to gain acceptance into the program needs to satisfy the admission requirements for both the MD program and the graduate program in their fields of study. The match-up of student with supervisor and project is tailored to each student. Preliminary explorations can be undertaken by candidates with prospective supervisors, and the MD/PhD committee can help to make the final decision. The recommendation for acceptance to the School of Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies is the responsibility of that committee.
