DEGREE

- Must be in the final year of, or have successfully completed, a four-year undergraduate university degree.
- Degree requirements must be completed by:
 - June 30, 2023 (undergraduate or thesis-based graduate program);
 - August 15, 2023 (course-based graduate program).

GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA)*

- Two best years that each meet all of the following:
 - Contain five full or equivalent courses (30 credit hours) completed during the September to April academic year;
 - Contain at least three full or equivalent courses (18 credit hours) at or above the year of study.
- If 2019-2020 is one of your two best undergraduate years, academic average will be calculated on grades from fall 2019 semester only.
- Graduate, summer and repeat courses are not included in the GPA calculation.

MEDICAL COLLEGE ADMISSION TEST (MCAT)*

- Must be written within five years prior to the application deadline.
- Only the most recent scores will be used.

WESTERN ABBREVIATED AUTOBIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

- Outline how your life experiences connect with four Schulich Medicine core values:
 - Respect for diversity, equity and inclusion;
 - Teamwork and leadership;
 - Self-directed learning, problem-solving and critical inquiry;
 - Social accountability and social responsibility.

CONFIDENTIAL ASSESSMENT FORMS

Completed by three non-family members who can attest to your character, interpersonal skills, and/or academic strengths.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- Be a citizen or permanent resident of Canada (except for applicants through the International Pathway);
- Demonstrate proficiency in written and spoken English;
- Have the Essential Skills and Abilities Required for Entry to a Medical Degree Program, as outlined by the Council of Ontario Faculties of Medicine.

OTHER APPLICATION STREAMS

Additional documentation is required for consideration through the following pathways:

Access Pathway

For applicants who may have faced a medical, financial or socio-cultural barrier or self-identify with a population underrepresented within medicine

Indigenous Pathway

Up to five seats for applicants who self-identify as Indigenous.

International Pathway

Up to three supernumerary seats at the Windsor Campus, for non-domestic applicants who must meet the same admission requirements as domestic applicants.

Military Medical Training Program Pathway

Up to three supernumerary seats for applicants who have been active members of the Canadian Armed Forces for a minimum of 12 consecutive months prior to the application deadline.

Southwestern Ontario Pathway

For applicants who attended and graduated from high school within the following counties: Grey, Bruce, Huron, Perth, Oxford, Elgin, Middlesex, Lambton, Chatham-Kent, Essex.
