3.0 UPDATES

3.1 PARO UPDATE - C. Gnyra

- On October 31, reps delivered over 200 treat bags to a variety of hospitals; the team hosted a successful apple picking event on November 4
- Last year the General Council team championed improved distributed housing standards, with the goal for distributed houses to be move-in ready; the DE team was supportive and provided a point of contact if residents had issues; recently a location in Windsor has been flagged as not being move-in ready; PARO asked to email the LE Office, Dr. Champion and Dr. Jacobs to provide more details to help facilitate improved standards.

3.2 PGME EDUCATION UPDATE - S. MacGregor

- Certificate in Leadership (CiL): first session November 16 Emotional Intelligence; 45 participants accepted
- Serious Illness Conversations Retreat (SICR) 2024: March 1 at Ivey Spencer; formerly the End of Life Care Retreat; nomination forms sent October 5; still accepting nominations
- Resident as Teacher Bootcamp (RTBC) 2024: February 8/9 at Ivey Spencer; nomination forms send October 11, due November 8; offers being sent December 1
- Needs Assessment 2023: results being reviewed, will be reaching out to programs over the next few weeks.

3.3 FATIGUE RISK MANAGEMENT - S. MacGregor

- Two modules have been developed; one for Programs and one for trainees/residents; designed to be a précis of the <u>Fatigue Risk Management</u> <u>Toolkit</u>; while guiding principles are clear, program implementation designed to be adaptable
- As part of Needs Assessment follow-up, will be reaching out to programs who are doing their own FRM training.

3.4 DRAFT GENERAL STANDARDS OF ACCREDITATION FOR RESIDENCY PROGRAMS - L. Champion

- Draft version but likely will be accepted and published for July 2024; programs will be held to standards as of 2025
- Important changes include: curriculum plan that includes development of skills related to physician wellness at various stages of physician life cycle; FRM changed to physician impairment; assessment language deletes 'achievement of competencies in all CanMEDS/-FM roles'; safety includes physical, psychological, cultural, and professional.
