| Discussion     | <ul> <li>Spring retreat set for April 21<sup>st</sup> and will focus on building competence committees . Resident Town Hall took place on March 21<sup>st</sup> with great representation from 17 programs and 30 residents . Common themes around: <ol> <li>EPAs and Milestones (CBME competencies vs. current objectives; procedural skills all at once or over time; achieving competence within allotted time; similarity across programs; and assessments when "off-service")</li> <li>Assessment process (faculty already too busy; inconsistency across consultants; more frequent observation; frequency of assessment and burnout; little face-to-face now, what are the expectations going forward)</li> <li>Progression and promotion (identification of the struggling trainee; awareness of different learning trajectories; more clarity for learners; need to earn independence; ability to request early assessment)</li> </ol> </li> <li>Residents will be great partners when your program rolls out; they are more concerned about</li> </ul> |  |  |

| Discussion       | . Computer-based Assessment for Sampling Personal Characteristics delivered by DC . Online assessment of personal/professional qualities that applicants can complete anywhere they have high-speed internet . Situational judgement tests (used in this application) have been shown to have so predictive value in selection . Measures have been put into place in order to ensure test security . 12 sections: 8 video vignettes (60-90 secs each), 4 self-descriptive questions, 3 pr questions after each Q/vignette; applicant has 5 mins to type answers . No cost to programs; cost to applicants (\$80 flat fee, results can be sent to any sc CASPer) . | Discussion       | . Three meetings thus far with representation across the country . The last meeting discussed the e-portfolio; three new versions over the next 12 m . Soft launch for programs who wish to upload their specific EPAs in the fall 2017 . Currently, in order to use the multi-source feedback tool, the user must have an at the RCPSC which is an extra step for allied health professionals   |   |  |

## 6. PHOTOGRAPHING IMAGING STUDIES

Dr. C. Watling

# Discussion

- . Some medical students have developed a habit of photographing imaging studies in order to share with others and use as an easy way to discuss without having to bring them up on the screen
- . Two concerns with this practice which should not be occurring: 1) the images were not appropriately anonymized and 2) they consider that a photograph of something does not actually create an adequate image quality in order to made diagnostic judgements or therapeutic decisions
- . There have been no complaints that residents are engaging in this activity but often medical students will follow what residents are doing  $\frac{1}{2}$
- . Photographs of images can't be done without anonymization and should be discouraged from happening
- . Dr. Watling will forward the instructions on how residents can anonymize images which is also included in the training provided by Medical Affairs
