5. MCCQI PART II S. Rumas				
Discussion	. Candidates expected to complete their PGY-1 by June 30 <sup>th</sup> will be able to challenge the exam in May of their first year of residency . Limited capacity will restrict the number of spots available for PGY-1 candidates in Spring 2016; however, numbers will increase for future sessions . Completion of 12 months of residency will remain a requirement for awarding the LMCC . PGY-1 registration will take place in January 2016 after all other candidates have applied . Priority given to other residents (PGY-2+) and physicians			
6. TRANSFERS	S. Rumas			
Discussion	. The transfer process for the fall began in September; applications were due by the end of September to PGME . These applications were forwarded on to the programs who expressed interest in accepting a transfer . November 30 <sup>th</sup> is the deadline for PGME to receive a response from the program which will then be communicated back to the resident

Discussion	. With the potential CMG/IMG reductions, accepting an ISR may be an option to fill capacity within your program . Applications have been sent to all programs who are considering taking an ISR but if you have changed your mind, please contact Kate O'Donnell and she will forward any applications PGME has received . Please let PGME know by the middle of November if you're interested in taking an ISR at the PGY1 or PGY4+ level for July 1 <sup>st</sup> , 2016 . Immigration processes take at least six months to obtain a work permit . These deadlines do not pertain to Clinical Fellows but the more time PGME has to work on the proper documentation, the more likely the trainee will start on time
