The AVP occurs concurrently with training and candidates will be exposed to the goals and objectives of the given specialty during the 12 week period. AVP licence expires and needs to be converted to a full educational licence. DISCUSSION	Dr. Watling presented competency-based medical education approach. Traditionally, assessment focuses on knowledge acquisition, program evaluation focuses on process. When time and process requirements are met, ability to apply what is learned is assumed. Competency-base medical education is outcome-focused education. Programs must demonstrate that a learner is competent for all aspects of practice. Outcomes guide curriculum decisions; processes are secondary.
