1. CBME Prog	ress Report Dr. S. Venance
Discussion	. CBME is likely to add pressures for Program Directors and require faculty development for assessment and documentation of competencies. How increased time could be funded, recognized and/or shared amongst several faculty members in any given program was discussed. Administrative and IT support will likely be needed, either within programs or centrally at the PGME office. . Concerns were raised about finding the time and willing faculty to take on CBME-centered roles, when education is not as valued when it comes to advancement. The pressure on producing results in research has led to a decrease in education as a priority for individuals. . The planning and implementation of CBME will likely need a much larger amount of time and support than it will after it is well established. . Program directors are encouraged to think about the resources they will need, the faculty and admin time that might be necessary, and what would help get faculty on board with the coming changes. . The general consensus was that there would need to be both funding and increased recognition for educational work.
