Clerkship IPE Assignment

Shadowing an Allied Health Care Professional

Objective: The clerk will gain insight into the role, knowledge and skills of an allied health discipline while comparing insights with their own disciplinary role, knowledge, and skills. Shadowing sessions should not be scheduled during an ER shift or a busy CTU shift and the time away from service must be approved by your preceptor in advance.

Required Assignment:

- 1. Spend a half day shadowing a health care professional. The clerk will be expected to do two assignments:
 - a. Spend a half day shadowing a nurse; AND
 - b. Spend a half day shadowing one other health care professional. Select a health discipline listed on the Office of Interprofessional Education and Research web-site: www.ipe.uwo.ca under 'Professionals in Teams'.
- 2. The reports are to be case-based. Students should shadow someone who is actively involved in the care of one of their patients. By doing so, the student can explore how different team members interact with each other in the care of a common patient.
- 3. IPE assignments will be tracked in the Yellow Book. This will provide Rotation Directors with the opportunity to discuss the experience with the clerk.
- 4. Student should consider addressing some of the following questions in their report:
 - a. Based on this experience, how will you change your practice with respect to working with allied health care professionals?
 - b. Do you think non-physicians on the health care team are under-appreciated? If so, why?
 - c. How would working with this allied professional differ in a rural community as compared to a teaching centre?

Assignment # 2 is due <u>April 29, 2014</u>
