I. PURPOSE

Remedial work is a period of supervised study to provide an opportunity for a student to address a failing grade in the clinical clerkship.

III. STATEMENT

- i. Terms of remediation are governed by the Doctor of Medicine (MD) Program Requirements.
- ii. If remediation is granted and successfully completed, a grade of PASS will be recorded on the student's Western transcript for the clerkship course and a grade of SRP will be recorded for the rotation.
- iii. In all cases, any costs related to the remediation of an assessment, course, rotation, academic year, etc shall be incurred entirely by the student. This includes the costs associated with proctoring, the use of standardized patients, the renewal of content for unique assessments etc.
- iv. The program will provide the total cost for remediation in the Letter of Remediation, if applicable.
- v. Remediation costs must be paid in full before a grade of fail will be changed and no later than the end of the academic during which remediation occurs (academic year, intersession, summer).
