COURSE OBJECTIVES

- 1. To have an understanding of the demographics and work-up of thyroid nodules.
- 2. To know the treatment algorithm and prognosis of thyroid cancer.
- 3. To identify visually common middle ear abnormalities through the tympanic membrane.
