## Anatomical Pathology Residency Program ANATOMICAL PATHOLOGY RESEARCH ELECTIVE ROTATION GUIDELINES

## Scope

An elective in research will permit the resident to concentrate on a research project that is planned or in process; this may include some or all of the following:

- literature search
- writing a proposal
- writing a grant application
- submission for ethics approval
- manuscript preparation
- preparation of a poster or platform presentation

## **Requirements**

The following requirements must be met:

- 1. The resident must have a supervisor: The supervisor will be responsible for approving the objectives, overseeing the rotation and completing the final evaluation.
- The rotation must have objectives: Objectives are required to specify what is to be accomplished
  during the elective. Objectives must be discussed with and agreed to by the supervisor, and be
  confirmed prior to the start of the rotation. Evaluation will be partially based on completion of
  the objectives.
