MEETING DESCRIPTION

This workshop will be divided into 2 parts, a skin pathology workshop in the afternoon and an optional add-on soft tissue pathology workshop in the morning.

The skin workshop will focus on pattern recognition in the diagnosis of inflammatory skin disorders, neoplastic lesions (including pitfalls that may result in litigation), and skin adnexal tumours.

The soft tissue workshop will present a practical approach to the work-up of cases which exemplify common diagnostic challenges in soft tissue pathology encountered in community pathology practice and discuss their differential diagnoses. Areas of focus will include: fibrous and fibrohistiocytic tumours, lipomatous and nerve sheath tumours, and acral soft tissue tumours.

Sessions are designed to improve diagnostic skills and provide practical tips for ancillary testing.

OBJECTIVES

By the end of this workshop, participants will be able to:

1. Identify distinguishing histological features of lipomatous tumors and superficial soft tissue neoplasms that are encountered in daily surgical pathology practice
2. Create a differential diagnostic list for this heterogeneous group of neoplasms
3. Utilize ancillary testing judiciously, to aid in the accurate diagnosis of soft tissue tumors
4. Apply a pattern recognition approach to skin rashes and avoid non-specific diagnoses
5. Create reports on challenging neoplastic skin diseases in order to reduce litigious diagnostic errors in a medicolegal framework
6. Use specific histologic and immunohistochemical features to create a differential diagnosis for unusual melanocytic lesions
7. Use specific histologic features to classify skin adnexal tumors
8. Use morphological features to help identify common and uncommon nonmelanocytic tumors, and recognise potential diagnostic pitfalls
