Undergraduate Studies Updates

- The last day of classes is April 8th. The final exam schedule has been posted by the registrar, and exams are running from April 10th to April 30th. Please make sure to have your exams to Michele in good time, so that she can properly format these for printing. You should have your exams marked within 7 days of the exam time, and your grades calculated in OWL, but we don't usually release these grades to students until the end of the exam period. Students who need to write a makeup will be writing on Tuesday, May 10th. This is our department's makeup exam day. Students who require a makeup will be scheduled to write either in the morning or afternoon, depending on the numbers of students per course. For permission to write makeup exams, students cannot use a self-reported absence (SRA) or use the self-isolation reporting tool (SIRT). They must go to academic counselling and provide a student medical certificate if it is for medical reasons or have approval from academic counselling if the request to write the makeup is for other reasons that they approve.
- With grading usually come appeals. If you have a student appealing a grade in your course, carefully consider the appeal and if you deny the appeal, please provide adequate details for the reason for your decline of the appeal and copy me on your denial. Students should be made aware of the steps of an appeal, which includes the ability to choose to escalate the appeal further to the Undergraduate Chair. The deadline for appeals for a course grade is June 30th. If a student appeals a grade in your course and you determine that it is a fair request, you do not need to copy me when you have the grade updated.
- Faculty members supervising fourth year thesis students will be asked to mark the student's final thesis. You will be contacted with the details for marking and

will also be assigned 1-2 other theses to evaluate as well. You can expect the marking assignments to be sent to you by April 11th. We also appreciate that this was a challenging year to incorporate fourth year students into labs as we returned to more in person events and experienced the return to online in January. Thank you for supporting your students through this time and providing continued training and mentorship.

- With the transition to Summer Term coming, graduate students should be aware that the GTA portion of their stipend will end from May 1 through August 31, unless they hold an additional TA position through the summer term.
