Undergraduate Studies Updates

- Along with our undergraduate courses, we are happy to welcome 73 honours thesis project students to the department. Thank-you to all of you who participated in interviews and agreeing to supervise students in your research labs. Students have been instructed to follow up with each of you to discuss the expectations of working within your labs (please go through the expectations document together). Communication is always essential, but particularly this year as students integrate back to in person learning, providing preferred ways for students to access supervisors, or lab members for support will be helpful to our students' progress through the thesis course.
- The add/drop period for the first semester is completed and our overall enrollment in our fourth-year courses has increased by 100 student seats. Thank you for agreeing to increase your course enrollments and the work by course managers, Chris Pin and Frank Beier, for launching courses new to our department this year. Similarly, we have seen an increase in the demand for our third-year lab course. Thanks to Oana Birceanu, along with the aid/support of Angela Beye, Christina Vanderboor and Hailey Hunter for strategizing how to increase our lab capacity to accommodate as many students as possible with our current lab structure.
- In addition to the many faculty members who are not named here for their exceptional work in our undergraduate program, we also want to acknowledge the large support our courses receive from our teaching assistants. We have an enormous number of students to train, and we are grateful for the role our graduate students play in assisting our department with its mission for education. Thank-you for your efforts in helping to teach the undergraduate students.
- Despite the year just beginning, we are already looking ahead to upcoming changes that will be coming to the BMSc program, and to the even larger class sizes that will come our way starting next year. We are already planning to increase capacity in our third-year lab course for 2022-2023 and are looking for creative ways to increase capacity in our other course offerings to accommodate the increased enrollment. Please expect to be asked to participate in the 3rd year lab course if not currently involved this academic year.
- Lastly, as we hopefully move beyond pandemic teaching, we will be organizing
 meetings with course managers to discuss ways to continue offering your
 courses and any changes that you may wish to implement for the subsequent
 academic year.
