This internal Schulich competition will be open to all PIs seeking funds (\$25,000 maximum) to acquire, develop or improve shared equipment directly used for research. The deadline for submitting applications will be December 5<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

Happening soon! The 2023 Department of Physiology and Pharmacology Gowdey Distinguished Lecture and Research Day will take place on Monday, November 6th, 2023. Trainee poster presentations will be between 9:30am – 1:30pm in the Great Hall (Somerville House). Research talks will begin at 2:00 pm in the McKellar Room (UCC 290). These featured research talks will take you on an investigative journey starting with in vivo physiology, through a physiological subsystem focus and ending with subcellular communication.
