## First year in review

Over the past year, the HDRN Canada Pragmatic Trials Training Program remained committed to fostering an engaging learning environment for 70+ enrolled learners.



In addition to sharing a new **learning module** each week, the program prioritized sharing **exemplar trials**, which have been valuable for helping learners connect theoretical concepts with practical application.



To support the program's human-centred and collaborative approach, the program held **protocol development meetings**, where learners worked collaboratively with a diverse team of researchers and partners to develop and refine the protocols, making them research-ready. The program also brought together **groups of 6–10 learners** each month to discuss key concepts and reflect on them with an expert facilitator.



This year, the program held its **first annual conference**, which provided a valuable opportunity for trial leads to present their developing protocols and engage in insightful panel debates with peers.



In line with its commitment to promoting culturally safe health research practices, the program encouraged both staff and learners to enroll in the Anti-Racism and Indigenous Cultural Safety Program (San'yas).
