







# Psychiatry Department Communication February 2020



Dear colleagues,

As the days start to lengthen, we are actively planning some exciting educational activities for you. First is the Cutting Edge Neuroscience Deserves Cutting Edge Teaching, a day-long workshop designed by Drs. David Ross and Ashley Walker. They are leading experts in adult learning theory and creative teaching methods. The day will include diverse learning opportunities such as playing a board game to facilitate discussions on well-being, molding Play-Doh into neuronal receptors, using hot topics in the media as a gateway to neuroscience, and drawing brain pathways to help patients learn about their own brains. Save April 1st as a day for your own growth as a teacher. It promises to be great fun.

We are also exploring ways of engaging in discussions around issues of the hidden curriculum. We all know what the explicit curriculum is, those learning objectives that we spell out to our learners. But we may not be paying enough attention to the hidden curriculum, which is the non-explicit teaching that occurs every time we are with our learners. Our students watch us carefully: how we talk about our patients, fellow staff and faculty members; how carefully we listen to resident presentations or review medical student notes; and how we use our body language, prosody, and gestures. The term, hidden curriculum, can refer to positive learning opportunities as well as negative.

In the coming weeks and months you will be hearing more about educational offerings regarding the hidden curriculum. We hope to create a learning atmosphere for these sessions that is fun and supportive. If you are interested in helping to design these offerings, please let me know.

The Merit Based Recognition Committee held a fruitful meeting. Through the committee's robust discussion, we decided to also hold an annual Stakeholders meeting. The purpose of this meeting is to hear about priorities from the larger community affected by our academic efforts. This Stakeholders group will include representation from medical students, residents, patients from patient advisory councils, family members from hospital advocacy groups, community partners, and someone from the Department of Medicine. We believe this broader perspective will enrich our understanding of what people value in our Department

Finally, as we improve our General Psychiatry Residency Program, know that this is an "all in" endeavor. Each of us will need to play a role in reorganizing and strengthening our program. With our collective wisdom, creativity, and dedication, I am optimistic for the future of our program and our trainees.

**Dr. Burhan** is working with the new and current faculty members in the Department to update mentorship committees for each faculty with the goal of tying mentorship with academic role category (ARC) and the promotion path. He already met with several faculty members and will continue to do so over the next 6 months. He is working on creating a "promotion map-clock", a tool to facilitate the review of promotion readiness by the faulty, their leaders and their mentorship committee.





Sub-specialty program in geriatric psychiatry that was recently fully accredited is pleased to fill the two spots for the July 2020, we welcome **Dr. Zainab Bhojani** and **Dr. Israel Spivak**. Also, we are pleased to share that the sub-specialty program in Geriatric Psychiatry was nominated for the 2020 Professional Association for Residents of Ontario (PARO) Residency Program Excellence Award for consistently providing positive experience for residents.

We continue to offer pragmatic intervention studies for patients and families dealing with Alzheimer disease and agitation. One such study is the S-CitAD study, which is offered to community or retirement home dwelling patients with Alzheimer or Alzheimer/vascular mixed illness with agitation, no history of failed trial of Citalopram or S-Citalopram, not currently on antidepressant (or if on, likely to be tapered due to lack of benefit or no indication), acceptable if on stable dose of other medications, we are happy to screen so please consider to refer by contacting Dr. Burhan on <a href="mailto:american:a



We continue to offer state-of the art electroconvulsive therapy, repetitive transcranial magnetic stimulation therapy (rTMS) and novel interventions like magnetic seizure therapy (MST), which is now provided as part of a pragmatic, intervention study for patients with bipolar depression. Below are details of the latter study:

CORRECT-BD: this is Brain Canada funded clinical trial for Magnetic Seizure Therapy vs. Ultra-brief Right Unilateral electroconvulsive therapy (titrated to individual dose) in bipolar depression (Bipolar I or II) patients 18 plus age, inpatients or outpatients, in a state of MDD without psychosis. As long as there is no other predominant mental illness please refer and we can pre-screen and decide if eligible so please consider to refer by contacting Dr. Burhan on <a href="majorage-american-am



Vanessa's Law requires all hospitals in Canada to report all serious Adverse Drug Reactions and Medical Device Incidents to Health Canada within 30 days of the initial discovery. Psychiatrists working in hospital settings need to be aware of their reporting requirements. This new legislation is expected to make care safer for Canadians regarding licensed medical devices and prescribed medications.

I am pleased to announce the 2019/20 Department of Psychiatry research seed funding competition.

As noted in the call for submissions, the primary intent of this competition is to support research by trainees (including residents, graduate students, and fellows) and junior faculty members. However, given on-going funding challenges in health research, we remain open to providing research funding support for mid- and senior-level researchers. All members of Western University's Department of Psychiatry are welcome to apply. Applications should clearly present study methodology, whether of a quantitative, qualitative, or mixed-methods approach.

The maximum budgetary amount available to support each project in this competition is \$7,500; smaller funding requests will also be considered. The deadline for applications is February 19th, 2020.
