# **Clinical Update**

- ❖ At LHSC, we are grateful Drs. Jamie Gregor and Paul Dulay for partnering with us to create a hospitalist model for inpatient care. The transition, thanks to all, went smoothly and we look forward to welcoming more hospitalist colleagues.
- ❖ At LHSC and SJHC: Thanks to all who helped ensure that our ECT service can serve all patients, regardless of clinical complexity. This cross-site collaboration and a shared set of care delivery procedures is a terrific model for us as a department.

### Recruitment

- ❖ We continue to be in full swing with recruitment. At SJHC, we are looking for an inpatient doctor and forensic specialist. At LHSC, the emphasis is on recruiting inpatient physicians, both psychiatrists and hospitalists.
- This fall, we are welcoming four new faculty members to LHSC's ambulatory program.
- ❖ Tips for writing a strong letter of recommendation:
  - -This website has a "before" and "after" example that describes the importance of being specific in support letters. Instead of writing that someone "was a great mentor," instead say, "was nominated by three students for the mentor of the year award."
  - Tell a story. It can be difficult to understand the significance of certain things from a CV and a LOR can tell a story about the importance. Instead of saying that someone created a new outpatient program, you can describe how the faculty member saw some unmet need, analyzed the gaps in services, and wrote a compelling business plan. Three years later, this clinician has served 483 patients, with a readmit rate of less than two percent. This unusual success rate was predominately due to the partnership with nursing to provide three times a week follow-up calls post-discharge.
