Building partnerships, knowledge exchange, problem solving and infrastructure support in order to achieve a range of specific and generalized health outcomes


Community food security

A situation in which all community residents obtain a safe, culturally acceptable, nutritionally adequate diet through a sustainable food system that maximizes self-reliance and social justice

Network

An association of individuals having a common interest, formed to provide mutual assistance, helpful information and the like for its members, who exchange information, contacts and experience for professional or social purpose.
