

2021 Resident Research Grant Fund- FAQ

1. Can I submit an RRG if I am not part of a node?

Yes, any resident in the Department of Surgery can submit an RRG.

2. Can I submit more than one RRG as the primary applicant?

Residents of the Department can only hold one RRG at a time so please only submit one RRG as the primary applicant.

3. I have already had two RRG's can I apply again?

A maximum of two RRG grants can be held by each eligible applicant during the course of their residency.

4. I am a fellow in the Department can I apply?

The RRG competition is only for residents in the department.

5. Can a faculty member be named as a supervisor on more than one RRG Application form?

Yes, there is no limit on how many applications a faculty member is listed as being the supervisor on.

6. Does my supervisor have to be a member of the node I am submitting my RRG to? Yes, if your supervisor is not part of the node you want to submit your RRG to they need to join the node.

7. Can I be a co-investigator on more than one application?

Yes, you can be a co-investigator on as many applications as you want.

8. My research budget is less than \$5000 is that okay?

Yes, that is okay. Research budgets should be for the amount of funds you need to cover the study costs.

9. My research budget is more than \$5000 is that okay?

You can submit a project that requires more than \$5000 to complete but you must include an explanation in your application as to where you will obtain the additional funds to complete your study if successful.
