Dr. Gerald Brock completed his Urology residency at McGill University in 1991. He then went on to complete a prestigious fellowship at the University of California, San Francisco in Neuro-Urology. He joined the Division of Urology at Western University in 1998. Dr. Brock is a Past President of the Canadian Urology Association and Past Chair of the Canadian Male Sexual Health Council. He is a renowned global expert in Andrology authoring over 200 manuscripts and book chapters. He has been an invited speaker across the world including the USA, Europe, Africa, Asia and Australia. Alongside these academic achievements, Dr. Brock has continued to be a dedicated mentor and inspiring teacher. His enthusiasm, compassion, humor and pragmatic approach to teaching have been invaluable to the training of countless residents. Dr. Brock was Program Director for the Urology residency program at Western University from 2009 to 2014. In this position,

he led our program towards a successful accreditation and implemented a number of initiatives including biannual Objective Structured Clinical Exams, the annual summer Olympics as a fun way to welcome the incoming residents to the team, and more recent the idea of cross-institutional OSCEs. It is with great pleasure that the Urology Residency Program of Western University announces the formation of the new Dr. Gerald Brock Resident Travel Award. 
New Faculty News

Highlight Excerpt from the 2019 Northeastern Section of the AUA



Dr. Eldon Busby was the first formally trained genitourinary surgeon to practice in London, Ontario. A graduate of Harvard University Medical School, Dr. Busby established the practice of urologic surgery in Southwest Ontario in 1930's and revolutionized the way bladder calculi and bladder outlet obstruction were dealt with for patients who normally endured open procedures by general surgeons. He performed the first TURP in Southwest Ontario in 1932 and was instrumental in identifying the need for non-electrolyte based solutions when performing trans-urethral resections.

Dr. Lloyd McAninch was the first Chief of Urology at Western University. A consummate surgical innovator, Dr. McAninch performed the first kidney transplant in Southwestern Ontario in 1965 and was instrumental in establishing the multi-organ transplant unit at London Health Sciences Center (the first in Canada) and introduced several advancements in the surgical treatment of advanced bladder cancer, including the cystectomy and ileal conduit procedure. Dr. McAninch established the urology training program at Western and was recognized for his contributions to the urology community by being elected to serve as President of both the CUA and NEAUA.



Dr. Jack Sales was a pioneering surgeon who was instrumental in establishing the extracorporeal shock wave lithotripsy program in London, Ontario. Dr. Sales served on several executive positions in both the Canadian and American urological associations and ultimately as President of both the Canadian Urological Association and the Northeastern Section of the American Urological Association. Dr. Sales led the creation and implementation of the NS-AUA Scholarship Foundation, which has helped pave the research careers of many distinguished urologists in Canada and USA. For these efforts, he was recognized by the Section with the highly coveted NS-AUA Distinguished Service Award in 2008.

Dr. Jack Wyatt served both as Chair of Urology and implemented the much needed formal didactic seminar and teaching sessions in his role as Residency Program Director at Western University. Dr. Wyatt made significant contributions to uro-oncology by instituting multi-modal therapy for advanced testicular cancer in the precisplatin era, by using high doses of methotrexate. Dr. Wyatt ultimately served as President of the CUA.

The annual Dash 4 Dad Father's Day Walk/Run for prostate cancer went virtual this year, due to the pandemic. Prostate cancer survivors, their family and friends, as well as supporters of the prostate cancer cause participated enthusiastically and donated generously. There was a 90-minute on-line live "Opening Ceremonies" program on Father's Day Sunday morning, which featured messages from prostate cancer survivors, organizing committee members and supporters, including one of the most prolific fund-raisers, a very spry 101 year-old lady! As part of the Trainees' Wellness program, our Residents and Fellows were out in full force with their individual runs on Father's Day. Some of the exciting action has been captured (photographs attached). This fund-raising event also featured an on-line auction, which included oil paintings by our own Dr. Pautler and Dr. Chin. A grand total of \$70,000 was raised this year, adding to the \$1.2 million which has been raised from the past 20 years through this event, with the proceeds going towards our prostate cancer research programs and education / awareness initiatives.

Adversity they say, makes us stronger. As the incoming Western Urology Program Director (PD), my initial plan was to prepare for a Royal College (RC) Accreditation process. There was no pandemic in sight and adapting and planning for it was not enlisted in the appointment letter! Unplanned adversity, should theoretically make us even stronger, as long as we do not wither. A heartfelt thank you to our Faculty and Residents for rising strongly to the challenge



and ensuring that both the standard of patient care and training, which define our Urology program, was not compromised. We did not wither! That, as PD and a proud member of our Division, is our key achievement this year.

The Accreditation challenge was negotiated, relatively easily, thanks to the leadership of our previous PD (Dr Sener), the support of Dr Wang - our dynamic and innovative Assistant PD, and our highly invested faculty and residents. A special thank you to Kim Nitz for her tireless efforts in preparing for this process and her contribution to our success was rightly acknowledged by the reviewers. This was a more scrutinizing process, given CBME (Competency Based Medical Education) and changes to the RC accreditation process. As a Program, we celebrate our full accreditation, with a review in 8 years. There was high commendation of our curriculum, processes, and leaders in our program. This pat on the back, however, means persistence and more work. The second challenge, was more fluid and required adaptation and resilience, Dr Wang led this initiative. Every program is proud of their residents because obviously, we selected them. However, the spirit and participation shown by our residents, during this pandemic defines their integrity and commitment to their education, patient care and significantly to our Program. Thank you, my resident team, very grateful and proud!

This year we bid a subdued "Covid farewell" to Dr Harmen Brar and Dr Roderick Clark. Flying the nest is a celebration of their achievement. But it does leave a tinge of sadness and we wish and spur them on to greater achievements in Cleveland and Toronto. We will remember them as they write their RC exams next week. Simultaneously, to make our family complete again, we welcomed our three new "Brothers in Arms" (my favorite Dire Straits song)- Carolyn, Haider and Will.

This is also a special year for us as a program as we welcome our ex-residents and fellows back home as colleagues - Drs Jennifer Bjazevic, Jeffrey Campbell and Melissa Huynh. They will enhance our program significantly as teachers and resident advocates.

The Competency Committee (CC), which forms the backbone of our evaluation process had some changes. This is the time to recognize the contribution of our two teacher-stalwarts who passed the baton on and 'retired' from the CC - Dr Pautler and Dr Luke. Their contribution, especially in the learning curve of the CBME process, is immense. We extend a warm welcome to Dr Bjazevic as an RTC member and Dr Razvi and Dr Campbell in our CC. The Program, it seems, keeps asking more and more of you all, but thank you for taking on these roles and responsibilities, so seamlessly and voluntarily.

This day, in the honorable memory of Dr John Wyatt, is a celebration of the endeavours of our residents and fellows, who took time out of their busy clinical work to complete research projects over this year. This reflects their commitment and acknowledges the support our Faculty provide as mentors to these presenters. I want to take this opportunity to especially thank our Research Faculty who provide wonderful opportunities and guidance to our residents. This led to two of our residents completing their Masters of Surgery successfully.




Follow the Fellows
